

# The Appleton School Sixth Form Results & Destinations

ACHIEVING EXCELLENCE

Students in our 2018 Year 13 cohort achieved a solid set of results:



- 100% achieved at least one Distinction grade level at BTEC Level 3 or at least one A-Level pass.
  - 98% of students achieved A\*-E A-Level passes (including equivalents).
  - 45% of grades achieved were A\*-B grades (including equivalents).
  - 74% of grades achieved were A\*-C grades (including equivalents).
  - The average Academic grade was C+.
- The average Applied General grade was a Distinction
- Over 90% of students who applied for university secured their top choice university.
  - 23% students gained a place at a prestigious Russell Group University.
  - A 100% Destination rate in total (the percentage of students who continue in education or training, or move on to employment at the end of 16 to 19 study).
  - 70% of Year 13 students went to university, 6% found employment and 16% gained an apprenticeship.
  - 97% Academic Retention rate, 100% Applied General Retention rate in Year 13 (the percentage of students who get to the end of their study programme).
