**Cultural Week 27<sup>th</sup> April 2026 to 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026**

**Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026: Traditional Clothing (Dress to Impress, Smart Clothing)**

As we celebrate the Cultural Week throughout this week, through various activities and events, I just wanted to remind you that **on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026**, we are inviting our students to wear their “traditional clothing” to celebrate different culture and diversity at the Appleton Community.

Traditional clothing is an important part of a region’s history and identity. Students are encouraged to attend school wearing clothing to reflect their own culture and identity, heritage colours, their school uniform with items of representation or even a flag.

If your child would like to take part to reflect their cultural identity but don’t have any traditional clothing, they could wear clothes in the colours of their cultural flag or a national sporting shirt which represents the flag for the country that they identify with and their respective cultures. These could be a national team’s Football, Rugby or Cricket shirt for example! **Please note that it is not a non-uniform day and we are not collecting any donations for the event. We don’t expect students to go out and buy clothes especially for the day.** Just see what you have at home.

Students will need to be in respectful dress which is appropriate for school:

1. Length of skirts should be the same length as school skirts or longer
2. No exposed midriiffs
3. No offensive logos / pictures on clothing
4. No rips in jeans above the knee (**smart clothing** only)
5. Inappropriate footwear will not be permitted
6. Jewellery needs to be in keeping with health and safety expectations in line with the school uniform policy

**Student expectations will remain the same throughout the day and students will follow their timetable as normal.**

The week promises to be a rewarding and enjoyable opportunity where our students can develop their cultural awareness as well as celebrate the differences. It will provide us the opportunity to recognise that there are a large number of cultures that exist and that all cultural expressions are valid. May I take this opportunity to say a huge “Thank you” for your support for the various projects, events and activities that are led by the Student Council Committee.
